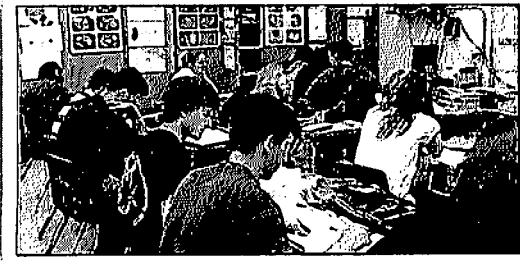

FAMILY & CONSUMER SCIENCE MISSION STATEMENT

CHILD CARE CO-OP (8823)

Grade Level: 12

Length: Year Credit(s): 2.0

Prerequisite: Parenting and Child Care I

Course Fee: No

Application Required

Child Care Services Co-op is a work-study program. The student will be employed in a child care environment. Employment may be during or after the school day. The student will earn at least minimum wage. To earn the credit, the student is required to work an average of 15 hours per week and to remain with the employer during the school year. A State-Skilled Certificate may be earned by students passing the necessary competencies.

CHILD CARE SERVICES I (TC) (8232)

Grade Level: 11-12

Length: Semester Credit(s): 1.0

Course Fee: No

Application required

This two-hour block course will prepare you for work either in the personal or professional child care field. You'll learn how to handle children and create hands-on activities for a real child care setting. You will also have the chance to work with young children in the HUHS Crayon Campus Preschool; and field trips to local day care centers will provide insight into various child care careers! This course is recommended for students interested in nursing, teaching, child care or any other related occupations. Students may also earn 3 college credits along with a DPI Child Care Certificate.

CHILD CARE SERVICES II (TC) (8236)

Grade Level: 12

Length: Year Credit(s): 1.0

Prerequisite: Child Care Services I

Course Fee: No

Application required

Earn your child care lead teacher license here! This class will qualify you to teach in a child care center and qualifies you for advance standing at a technical college in the field of child care. Qualified students may have the opportunity to earn an additional credit for the year by enrolling in Child Care Services Co-op and being placed in a child care center.

CULINARY ARTS I (TC) (8221)

Grade Level: 10-12

Length: Semester Credit(s): 0.50

Course Fee: Yes

Welcome to the world of Culinary Arts! In this course, you will learn everything from nutrition to plate presentation. In between, we'll practice our knife skills, and have the opportunity to work with, and sample, fruits, vegetables, salads, sandwiches, breakfast foods, dairy products, cream soups, and breads such as biscuits, muffins, and pizza. More importantly, students can earn technical college credit in the class.

CULINARY ARTS II (TC) (8222)

Grade Level: 10-12

Length: Semester Credit(s): 0.50

Prerequisite: Culinary Arts I

Course Fee: Yes

Expand your talents and love for food in Culinary Arts II. Here you'll discover ways to make beautiful garnishes, and learn a variety of methods for preparing meats and poultry. Students will also make a variety of egg dishes, along with stock soups and casseroles. There will also be a convenience food competition and best of all, students can earn technical college credit in this class.

Learn about the history of fashion, basic textiles, channels of distribution, major names in design and different trade publications. Study the top ten fashion designers while creating your own fashion label and logo. You will also apply your creative talents while making a garment using a sewing machine. We will be taking a field trip to Chicago to meet a Fashion Designer and explore the fashion market. There will even be an opportunity to travel to New York to experience the many avenues of the fashion industry. More importantly, students can earn college credit for taking this course.</p>
<p>→ FASHION & DESIGN II (TC) (8212) Grade Level: 10-12 Length: Semester Credit(s): 0.50</p> <p>Prerequisite: Fashion & Design</p> <p>Course Fee: No</p>	<p>Multiple hands-on activities will keep you excited as you go on an Internet shopping spree while learning about your body type, facial shape, and elements of design. Discover the various business functions in the fashion industry. Design your own line of clothing for yourself and for the movie industry. Step into the shoes of a fashion editor and create a magazine cover and help produce a fashion show! You can also head to Chicago and New York to explore the fashion industry in greater depth, and even earn college credit for taking this course. This class could even lead to a Fashion and Design Internship your senior year. Students taking Fashion & Design I cannot take Fashion & Design II the same year.</p>
<p>→ FOOD SERVICE AND HOSPITALITY (8223) Grade Level: 12 Length: Year Credit(s): 1.0</p> <p>Prerequisite: Completion of any two of the following courses: Introduction to Food & Hospitality, Culinary Arts I and/or Culinary Arts II</p> <p>Course Fee: Yes Application required</p>	<p>The purpose of this course is to assist the student in obtaining the necessary skills needed to enter the world of work or post-secondary education in the field of food and/or hospitality services. Qualified students may have the opportunity to earn an additional 2 credits by enrolling in Food Service & Hospitality Co-op and being placed in a food service/hospitality position. Those students should also sign up for the Food Service & Hospitality Co-op.</p>

Students may be released during the school day or work after school. Recommendation by the instructor is required and acceptance into the program is through an interview process by the employer. Students must remain in the program for one full year.</p>
<p>→ FRIENDS and FAMILY (8201) Grade Level: 9-10 Length: Semester Credit(s): 0.50</p> <p>Course Fee: No</p>	<p>Dating can be a fun and exciting time in your life. New friendships are also being built and family situations are constantly changing. Need some tips? Then this course is for you! This class will help you build self-confidence, and communicate better with friends, family, and members of the opposite sex. HEALTH CAREERS INTERNSHIP (8828)

Grade Level: 12

Length: Year Credit(s): 1.0

Prerequisite: Introduction to Health Careers

Course Fee: No

Application required

Seniors work an average of 15 hours per week in the Health Career field while earning at least minimum wage. Students must remain in the program one full year. Students may be released during the school day or work after school. Recommendation by the instructor is required and acceptance into the program is through an interview process by the employer.

INTERIOR DESIGN TC (8233)

Grade Level: 11-12

Length: Semester Credit(s): 0.50

Course Fee: No

Have fun creating the interior and exterior appearance of the HUHS Vision House. You will discover how to read blueprints, identify home styles, select lighting, floor coverings, window treatments, wall coverings and hardware while using the elements of design. You will have an opportunity to try your hand at painting, along with re-designing a classmates living space. This course can even lead to an Interior Design Internship your senior year. You can earn college credit for taking this course!

INTERIOR DESIGN INTERNSHIP (8826)

Grade Level: 12

Length: Year Credit(s): 1.0

Prerequisite: Interior Design

Course Fee: No

Application required

Seniors work an average of 15 hours per week in the Interior Design field while earning at least minimum wage. Students must remain in the program one full year. Students may be released during the school day or work after school. Recommendation by the instructor is required and acceptance into the program is through an interview process by the employer.

INTRO TO FOOD & HOSPITALITY (8202)

Grade Level: 9-10

Length: Semester Credit(s): 0.50

Course Fee: Yes

Do you like to travel to new and exciting places? This is your chance to grab a backstage pass into the hotel, restaurant and tourism industry! Discover exciting jobs; learn how a restaurant operates; plan vacations; discover your culinary skills; design a hotel; develop restaurant-style menus; and enjoy labs in the kitchen, including appetizers, breakfast meals, lunch meals, salads, beverages and desserts!

INTRODUCTION TO HEALTH CAREERS (TC) (8255)

Grade Level: 10-12

Length: Semester Credit(s): 0.50

Course Fee: No

A career in the medical field awaits you! This area is the fastest growing industry in the 21st century. Hands on activities include taking temperatures, measuring blood pressures, reading an x-ray, using stethoscopes and exploring lab procedures! You can identify your strengths through career exploration, personality profiles and guest speakers. Many topics are covered in this class to give you an overall perspective of the health care field! Best of all, students can earn a technical college credit in this course.

LIVING ON YOUR OWN (8242)

Grade Level: 12

Length: Semester Credit(s): 0.50

Course Fee: No

Ready to live by yourself and make your own rules? This class gives you a great first taste of the real world. Learn about high-paying jobs, choosing the best apartment, dealing with roommates, car-buying strategies, handling money, buying that dream home, and preparing for retirement thru savings and investing. You'll even learn how to make great financial decisions so that you are set for life. This course meets state financial literacy standards.

PARENTING (TC) (8231)

Grade Level: 10-12

Length: Semester Credit(s): 0.50

Course Fee: No

Learn parenting skills through simulated activities which include computerized babies and the pregnancy belly. You can earn college credit for taking this course. Gain the advantage of being an all-star parent by learning brain-development skills. Hands on activities include bathing, diapering, and dressing a baby, choosing toys and clothing, child-proofing your house, comparing store brands vs. homemade baby food, and labs to play with children. There will also be a field trip to the "Birth Day Center" at the local hospital and guest speakers sharing their expertise in child care.
