
## We ARE Listening. Here's What The Community Is Saying

- A Community Facilities Survey was sent to all HUHS District residents last May.
- More than 62% said they would support a referendum around \$25 million.
- Their top priorities focused on infrastructure needs like security, roofing, and heating.

On August 7th, the HUHS Board of Education unanimously voted to put a

\$25.8 million referendum question on the November ballot.







You may be surprised to learn the state school funding model makes it difficult to pay for large scale capital improvements. By law, districts are required to go to referendum to increase the tax levy to address capital needs. That's why you see so many Wisconsin School Districts asking their communities to invest. The last HUHS community referendum investment was 24 years ago for \$2.9 million.
